

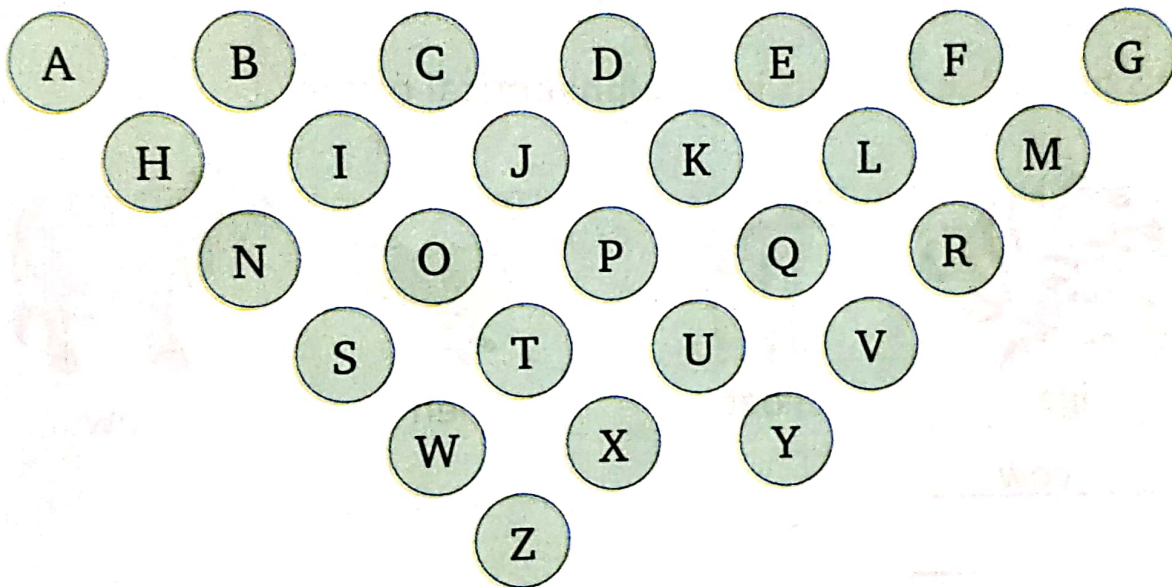
The Alphabet

The English alphabet is a set of letters. There are 26 letters in the English alphabet family.

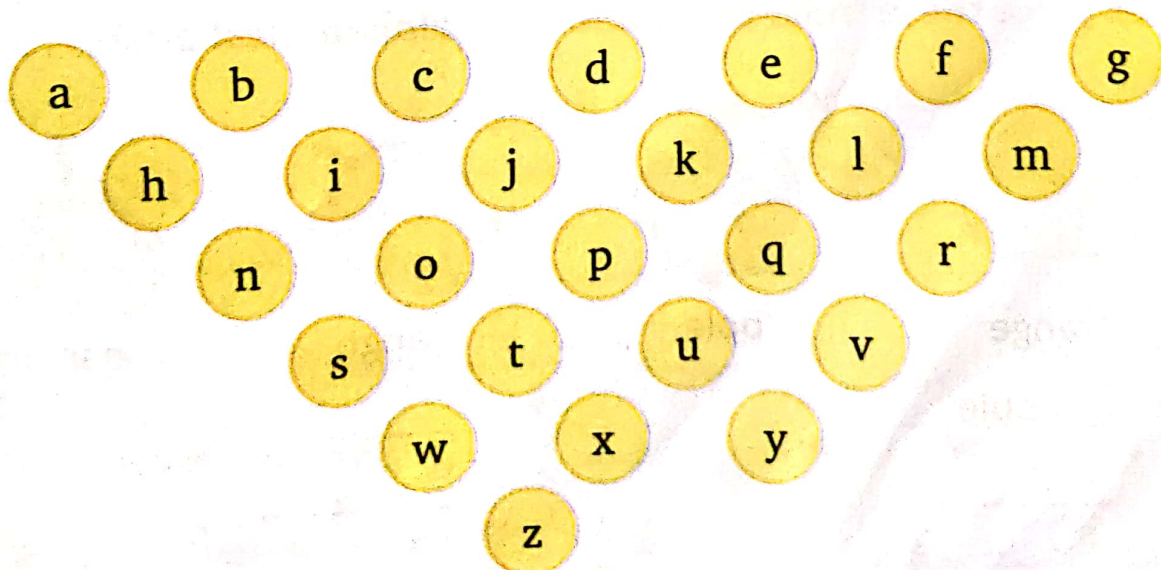
The letters in English alphabet are written in two ways.
